

Lenten Reflection

The synoptic gospels give a description of Jesus' time in the wilderness. The Gospels of Matthew and Luke give us a more detailed account of what Jesus experienced during these 40 days and 40 nights. Temptations arose from the enemy, who wanted to test Jesus' commitment to God's commission. It is similar to why temptations come into our lives. Many believe that when temptations come, it is the enemy at work. I would pause and stretch us to think differently. As part of the human experience temptations will come. It is how we respond to the temptation that shows our strength and growth in our faith.

During His time in the wilderness, while fasting and praying, Jesus became famished. When we are hungry, we may not always think effectively and will not always make the best decisions. This is what the enemy was counting on with Jesus. However, when Jesus was tempted to turn stones to become loaves of bread, Jesus responded, "One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:3-4). On its face, we may see how this can be an effective way to eat and solve His hunger issue. However, the enemy used his weakness and what the enemy thought would be Jesus' ego by asking "If You are the Son of God, do this act." Jesus had absolutely nothing to prove!

We are to be prayerful to help God work on our egos, so we are not tempted to operate out of ego and always operate out of the Holy Spirit! I invite us in this Lenten season to ask the question, "Where are the places in my life where I'm not yet the person I believe God longs for me to be?"

The answer to this question lies within all of us. The answer to this question is where our work begins. Let us pray for God to reveal these spaces and give us the courage to start our work for the transformation of new beings in Christ! Let us be encouraged along our journey so we will walk out of the wilderness stronger, wiser, and willing to be yielded vessels for Christ!
